

An Order for Night Prayer (Compline) during Ascensioentide

Preparation

The Lord almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end.
Amen.

Our help is in the name of the Lord
who made heaven and earth.

*A period of silence for reflection on the past day may follow.
The following or other suitable words of penitence may be used*

**Most merciful God,
we confess to you,
before the whole company of heaven and one another,
that we have sinned in thought, word and deed
and in what we have failed to do.
Forgive us our sins,
heal us by your Spirit
and raise us to new life in Christ. Amen.**

O God, make speed to save us.
O Lord, make haste to help us.

**Glory to the Father and to the Son
and to the Holy Spirit;
as it was in the beginning is now
and shall be for ever. Amen.
Alleluia.**

The following or another suitable hymn may be sung

Before the ending of the day,
Creator of the world, we pray
That you, with steadfast love, would keep
Your watch around us while we sleep.

From evil dreams defend our sight,
From fears and terrors of the night;
Tread underfoot our deadly foe
That we no sinful thought may know.

O Father, that we ask be done
Through Jesus Christ, your only Son;
And Holy Spirit, by whose breath
Our souls are raised to life from death.

The Word of God

Psalm 86

- 1 Incline your ear, O Lord, and answer me, ♦
for I am poor and in misery.
- 2 Preserve my soul, for I am faithful; ♦
save your servant, for I put my trust in you.
- 3 Be merciful to me, O Lord, for you are my God; ♦
I call upon you all the day long.
- 4 Gladden the soul of your servant, ♦
for to you, O Lord, I lift up my soul. [R]
- 5 For you, Lord, are good and forgiving, ♦
abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon you.
- 6 Give ear, O Lord, to my prayer ♦
and listen to the voice of my supplication.
- 7 In the day of my distress I will call upon you, ♦
for you will answer me. [R]
- 8 Among the gods there is none like you, O Lord, ♦
nor any works like yours.
- 9 All nations you have made shall come and worship you, O Lord, ♦
and shall glorify your name.
- 10 For you are great and do wonderful things; ♦
you alone are God. [R]
- 11 Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth; ♦
knit my heart to you, that I may fear your name.
- 12 I will thank you, O Lord my God, with all my heart, ♦
and glorify your name for evermore;
- 13 For great is your steadfast love towards me, ♦
for you have delivered my soul from the depths of the grave. [R]
- 14 O God, the proud rise up against me
and a ruthless horde seek after my life; ♦
they have not set you before their eyes.

15 But you, Lord, are gracious and full of compassion, ♦
slow to anger and full of kindness and truth.

16 Turn to me and have mercy upon me; ♦
give your strength to your servant
and save the child of your handmaid.

17 Show me a token of your favour,
that those who hate me may see it and be ashamed; ♦
because you, O Lord, have helped and comforted me.

*God of mercy,
who in your great love
drew your Son from the depths of the Pit,
bring your people from death to life,
that we may rejoice in your compassion
and praise you now and for ever.*
